# **Introduction and Purpose**

This conference is an invitation to mental health professionals, legislators, attorneys, mediators and members of the judiciary to discover solutions in the new reality of dual provider families. Shared primary care responsibilities require a new developmental paradigm for post divorce families in the 21st century.

Fifty percent of our marriages end in divorce, and the creation of new family systems and fifty percent of our children live with one biological parent. Mental health professionals are still proposing anachronistic models that grew out of the concept of child development in a nuclear family. Legislatures and the courts are trying to create civil order out of what amounts to societal chaos without benefit of social models for the 21st century.

The losers-post divorce parents and children impoverished emotionally and financially by high conflict divorce; by higher stakes for all parties with relocation of custodial parents; by marginalization of non custodial parents; and by criminalization of post divorce parental behaviours.
